COVID-19 Emergency Response Fund

The COVID-19 Emergency Response Fund was created to provide financial assistance to non profits addressing relief efforts due to the pandemic. These grants specifically helped local food pantries, feeding programs, preschools, and assisted organizations responding to emergency financial needs and distressed non-profits. Over \$35,000 in grants were distributed in addition to purchasing masks for Pettis County school districts.

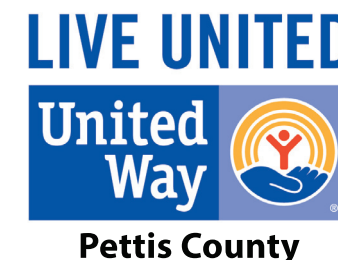
